1) Dinner Nights :

- I. The Dinner group pay £26 per week for a room
- II. Funds required to support dinner nights until new funding comes into effect (possibly 11 weeks some refund may be expected from the Pearce and the date of the commence of funds is not certain)
- III. A vote was taken – unanimous agreement to support the dinner nights around £2required to support dinner nights until new funding comes into effect probably April 13

2) Accounts

- I. Now that LEGUP no longer exists it was asked what was the state of funds remaining
- II. A name for the group would be decided and a bank account set up with the new name
- III. It was decided that it might be useful to ask CH the only signator remaining in Scotland to clear and close the old account if funding garden needs would be troublesome.
- IV. Since it is expected that dinner nights, current bills and garden needs would more or less use up remaining funds, it was decided to ask CH to transfer those funds to MB to pay for the above
- V. It was asked if paying an advance on the dinner nights might get a discount
- VI. It was also pointed out that dinner nights might have saved money by using the garden during the summer

4) Garden Needs

- I. A source has offered to build the garden raised bed boxes or cold frames
PB & MB will look into it
- II. MIG welder could cost as much as £200 and would need 2kv generator to run it (c £180) perhaps it would fix the gate and other holes in the perimeter to make the site more secure
- III. Unanimous agreement to go ahead and purchase welder and decent generator
